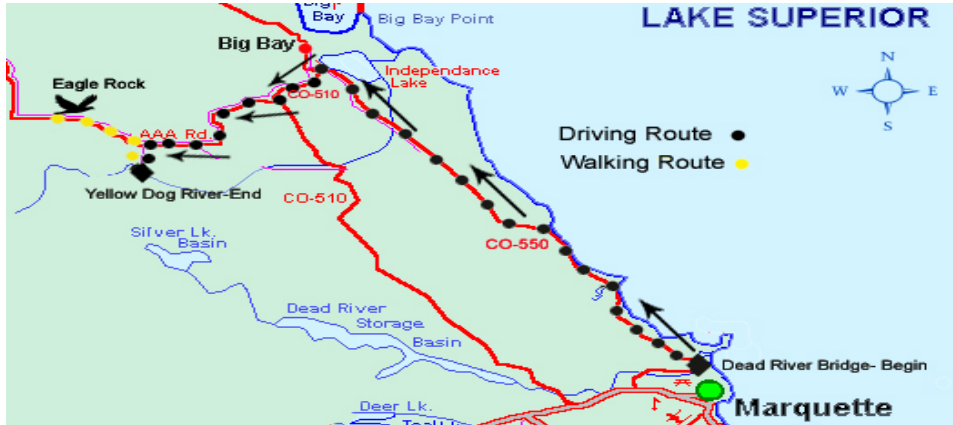

From Marquette: Get onto County Road 550 north of Marquette. Drive 25 miles along County Road 550 going northwest. At the intersection of County Road 550 and County Road 510, turn left. Drive 3.1 miles until you reach AAA road. Turn right onto AAA road. Drive 3.1 miles until you reach a Y in the road. Stay left. Continue for 5.0 miles until you reach the Clowry Road. Turn left and drive until you reach the bridge over the Yellow Dog River. Park here.

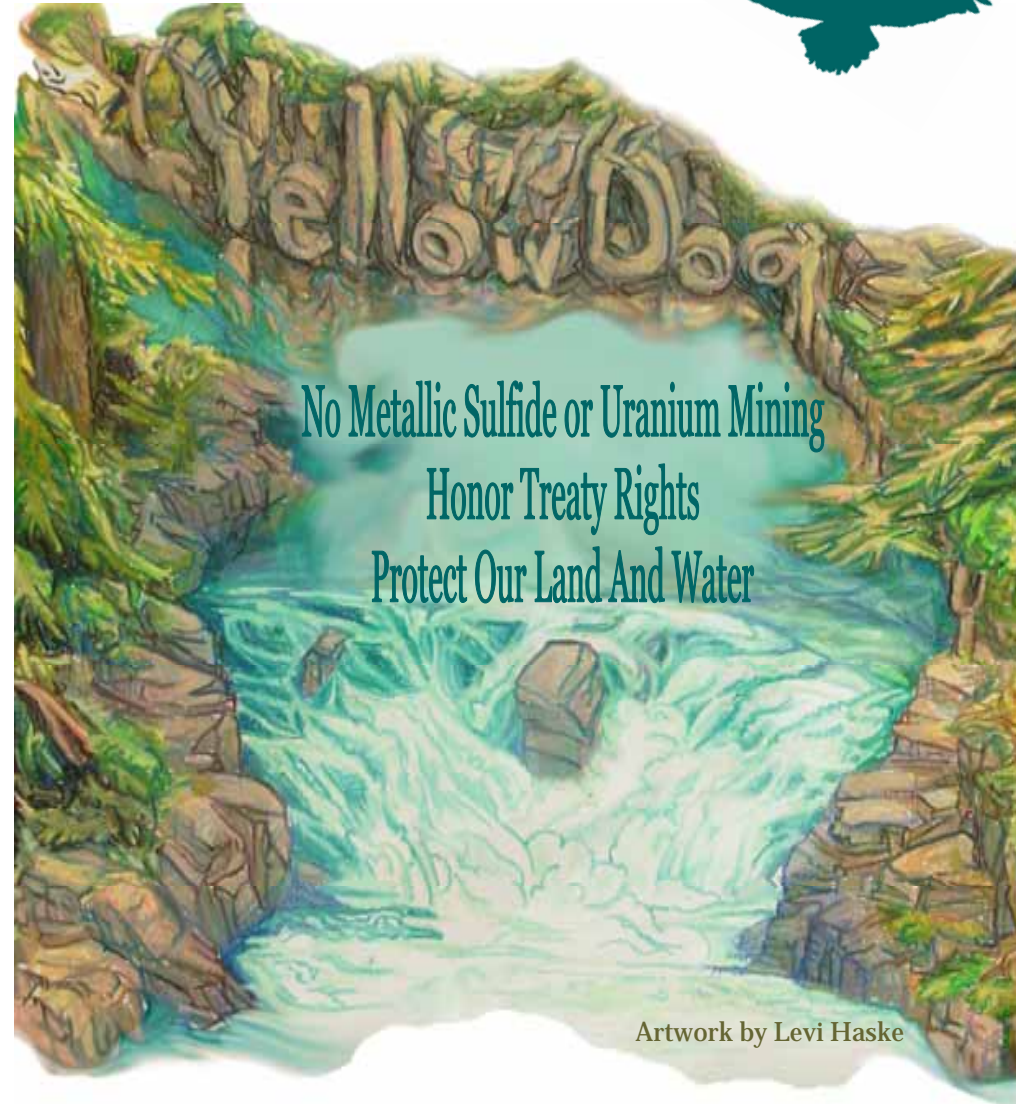
### The Walk

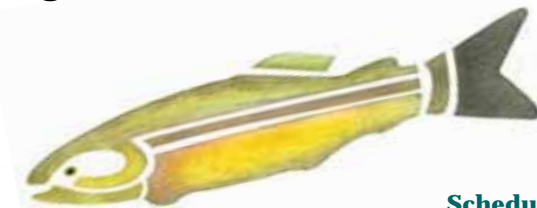
